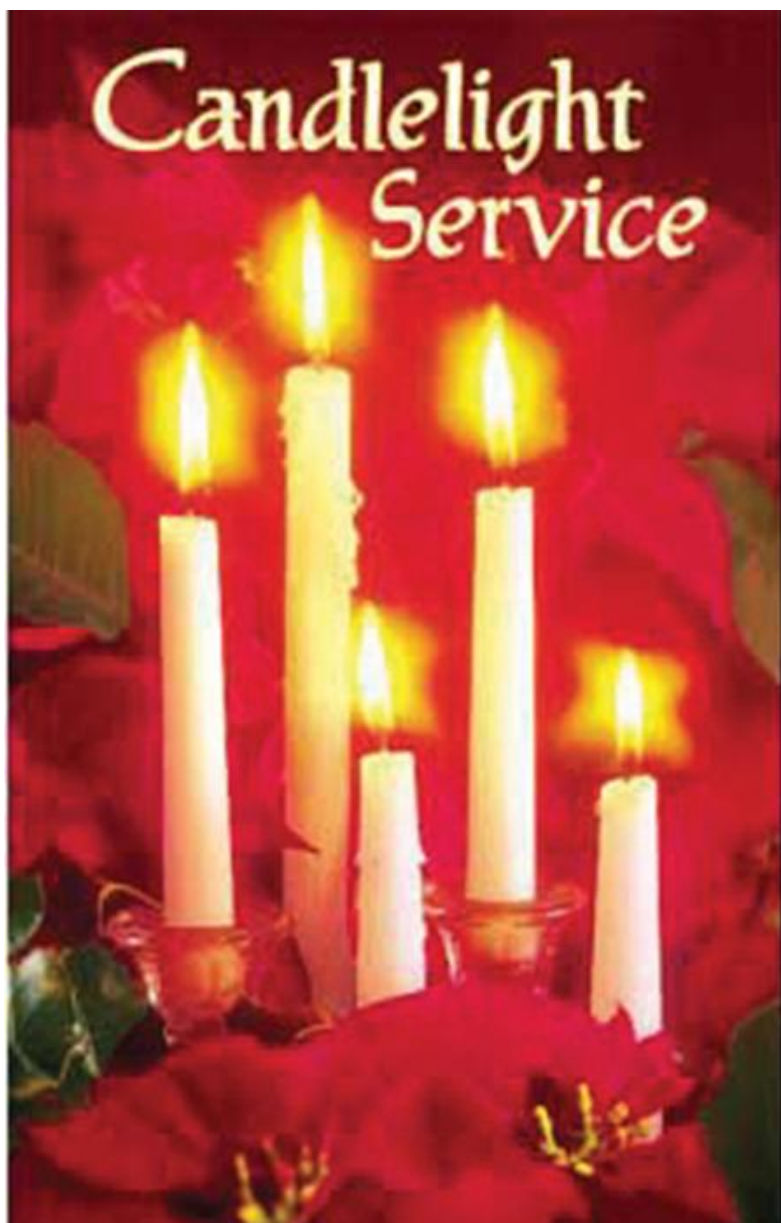

First Lesson:

Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined. You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil. For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult and every garment rolled in blood will be burned as fuel for the fire. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. Second Lesson:

Titus 2:11-14

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works.

Gospel Reading: Luke 2:1-20

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child.

And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.

And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you

is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.”

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!”

When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us.” And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger.

And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart.

And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.

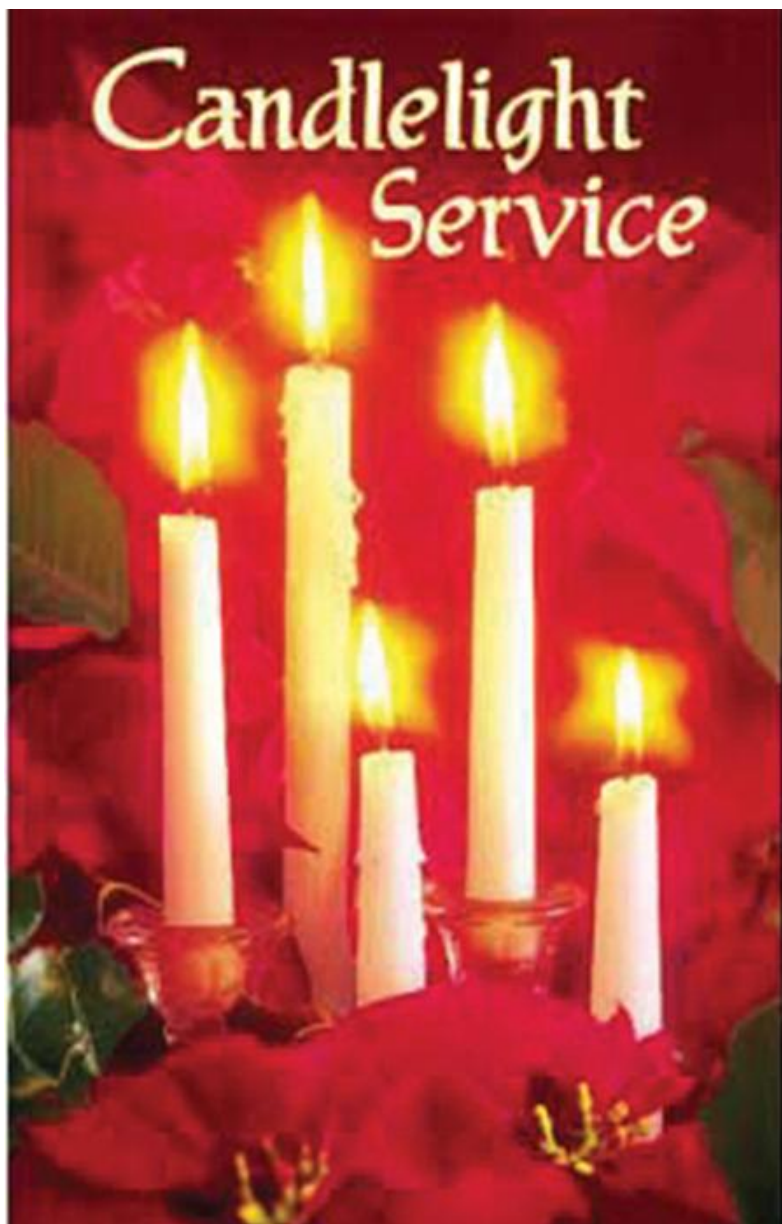

2023 - MAKING LIFE COUNT: Learning to Share!
Worship & Bible Study Series
December 31st, 2023 – February 11th, 2024

Overview: Beginning in this New Year, we will start with a focus on that which is most important. Making Life Count: Learning to Share! This is a series that will help each of us learn and grow in our abilities to share our faith with the people God places around us. We leave the sanctuary Christmas weekend oftentimes to the strains of “Go Tell It on the Mountain”. And yet, the actual telling part is harder than many of us are able to accomplish.

How many times have we walked away from a situation where we thought, “Man, if only I had said, ‘...’” or something to that effect? In worship we will be going through scriptures that will help guide us in this direction. And we will pair those lessons in our time together in Bible Study on Monday mornings.

Below are the gospel lessons that will be our launching point as we work our way through the gospel of John. And the main point for each week is included as well. Each week we will have more detailed handouts, which will include some interactive questions and discussion points also.

Dec. 31st Sharing With Skeptics John 1:45-46
Main Point: Stop arguing about the reasonable nature of faith; the most important aspects of faith are not reasonable.

Jan. 7th Sharing With Educated Seekers John 3:1-12
Main Point: Jesus allowed Nicodemus and also allows us time to consider the truth.

Jan. 14th Sharing With Social Outcasts John 4:3-26
Main Point: Jesus embraced social outcasts and through them reached even more people.

Jan. 21st Sharing With Those Trapped In Sin John 8:1-11

Main Point: Jesus reminds us that we are all in need of a Savior and are unfit to “cast the first stone.”

Jan. 28th Sharing With Those Overcome By Affliction John 9:1-7

Main Point: Jesus reminds us that every situation is an opportunity for the gospel.

Feb. 4th Sharing With Those Overwhelmed By Grief John 11:11-27

Main Point: Death is not the end of life, but it does require compassion and understanding if we want to bring comfort.

Feb. 11th The Basics of Sharing John 20:30, 31

Main Point: When it is all said and done, the only thing that matters for all eternity is where you and those you impact stand with Jesus.
