

The month of April this year is a special time on our church year calendar. We open the month continuing the season of Lent. April 14th is Palm Sunday. We are confirming four Confirmands. As the week progresses it is the most solemn time of year for Christians. We remember Jesus willingly going to the cross for us. The solemnity of the week gives way to joyful celebration on Easter Sunday: "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" We have much to celebrate as Christians. God in Christ Jesus has conquered sin and death.

There is something else about Easter that I would have you consider. Communication is written large in the Easter story. Angels are sent to inform the women at the tomb that Jesus has risen from the dead. The women are to pass the word on to the disciples, and the disciples are in turn instructed by the risen Christ to proclaim the Good News in all the world. The gospel accounts by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, in which we read all this, are themselves a vital part of this proclamation.

To be told and then to tell—that is why we call pastors, build churches, and assemble in those buildings for worship. In God's house the message of Christ is communicated anew, "Peace be with you." Present with us, Jesus gives the peace He has won for us—forgiveness of sins, reconciliation with God, newness of life in Him. Having been told the Good News, we now tell others. That is the mission inherent in the Easter event.

Christianity is never a passive message. We are always receiving Christ's forgiveness but, also always looking outside of ourselves. My prayer for all of us at Faith Lutheran Church is that Christ would so fill us with the message of Easter that we won't be able to "hold in" this blessed news. As his disciples we are given to communicate to today's generation "that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures." (1 Cor. 15:3-4)

There is a verse from one of our Easter hymns that captures this rejoicing/telling others aspect of the Easter message.

Then sing your hosannas and raise your glad voice; Proclaim the blest tidings that all may rejoice. Laud, honor, and praise to the Lamb that was slain: With Father and Spirit, He ever shall reign. (LSB 480, stanza 5)


